## **Library Usage Reporting (Milestones)**




- 1999: Paper reports mailed/faxed to customers
- 2000: Usage reports were sent by email
- 2001: Founding Partner of COUNTER
- 2003: Major new release enabling librarian log-on and remote downloading
   COUNTER Release 1 of the CoP for ScienceDirect
- 2005: COUNTER compliance Release 1 of the CoP for Scopus
   New User interface, integration with Librarian Admin tool
- 2006: COUNTER Compliance release 2 of the CoP for ScienceDirect
- 2007 & 2008: COUNTER audits by ABC Auditors



### **Becoming Interlinked**






In 2000 full text platforms were closed boxes

### **Becoming Interlinked**








In 2008 all platforms are interlinked


